



Does your life mostly depend on you personally, on the state or on other people?


Do you think that the Russian state interferes or doesn't interfere in the private life of its citizens?






INDIVIDUAL AND EVERYDAY LIFE

In your opinion, who should provide care for the elderly: the state, children/relatives or they should care for themselves?




People protect their interests in different ways.






Freedom for us... It seems to me that we live in absolute freedom... Living on our land, growing whatever we want. Rely on ourselves. Do we need any other kind of freedom?


Female, 62 years old


Female, 47 years old

Freedom is confidence in your future. It is when all my thoughts and wishes are, a priori, right and fair, if they don't contradict with the Criminal and Administrative Code.



In your opinion, the majority of the Russian population lives by the law or rather by informal rules, personal agreements?


Do you personally live rather by the law or rather by informal rules, personal agreements?



LAWS, CONTROL


A woman takes a business trip. She is late for her flight because of a traffic jam and she violates traffic rules. The police stops her and starts preparing official documentation. In order to get through the whole

FREEDOM AND (OR) SECURITY








FREEDOM AND (OR) SECURITY







FREEDOM AND (OR) SECURITY


Do you consider import restrictions on foreign goods useful or not useful?






FREEDOM AND (OR) SECURITY

MASS MEDIA, FREEDOM OF SPEECH, REMEMBRANCE






Do you think that the mass media should always be controlled by the government, should be controlled only in special cases, e.g. for security reasons, or should be absolutely free?






